

Get Typhoid Vaccination, Authorities Warn Citizens

A list of health unit clinics for typhoid vaccinations will be carried each day by the Free Press as a public service. Additional precautions to safeguard health during the flood emergency will also be announced.

TYPHOID VACCINATIONS

Medical directors in suburban health units warn that all people working in flood waters and living in homes with flooded or plugged basements should receive immunization against typhoid fever. Unless you have been vaccinated within the past 12 months you should attend a clinic or see your own doctor.

Clinic times may be changed from day to day, so check this paper for the latest schedules. Special clinics and times are:

St. James

In the St. James health unit, civic offices, each morning from 9 to 10 a.m. and each evening from 7 to 9 p.m.

In Bannatyne school, every Friday from 3 to 6 p.m.

St. Vital

In the St. Vital fire hall, Thursday from 4 to 6 p.m. and Friday and Saturday from 9.30 to 10.30 a.m.

Fort Garry

In the health unit offices in the municipal building, every day from 4 to 5 p.m.

St. Boniface

In the St. Boniface health unit office, behind the city hall, Wed-

nesday from 2 to 4 p.m.; Thursday from 2 to 4 p.m., and from 7.30 to 9 p.m.; Friday from 1.30 to 4 p.m., and from 7.30 to 9 p.m.; Saturday from 9 a.m. to 12 noon and from 2 to 4 p.m.

East Kildonan

In the John Black Memorial church, Henderson highway and Roberta street, every day from 9 a.m. to 12 noon and from 6 to 7.30 p.m.

West Kildonan

In Centennial school, 1.30 to 4.30 p.m. and from 8 to 9.30 p.m.

The department of health's clinic at the St. Boniface Out-Patient department has been discontinued. Patients should apply to the special clinic at 320 Sherbrook street.
