

George N. Suttie First Mayor Of New City of East Kildonan

The honour of being the first mayor of the City of East Kildonan falls on the shoulders of George Nordland Suttie, the municipality's eighth chief magistrate.

Although only serving the municipality as mayor since last year, Mr. Suttie has a great deal of experience, having been a member of Council from 1938 to 1956.

Mr. Suttie has the happy faculty of listening patiently to complaints and delegations at Council meetings.

He appears to thrive on his work and when complainants realize he is sincere in what he says, everyone leaves the council chambers happy and the best of friends.

Born in Winnipeg, Mr. Suttie has lived in East Kildonan for the past 34 years. An electrotyper by trade, he has been with Rapid, Grip & Batten for the past 43 years.

He is a past president of the Winnipeg Club of Printinghouse Craftsmen, past president of the Stereotypers and Electrotypers Union, life member of the Suburban Municipal Association, and has served on the executives of the Manitoba Urban Association, the Union of Manitoba Municipalities, the Blind Institute and the Manitoba Cancer Institute.

A number of years ago Mr. Suttie spent quite a bit of time playing both five and ten pins, was a leader in a Boy Scout group and also a leader in a wrestling class at the YMCA.

East Kildonan's cigar-smoking witty mayor can never quite get over the growth East Kildonan has made. "Particularly in the last 10 years," he said, "it has been tremendous."
