

Dedication Of Grace Lutheran Church Sunday

The former Community Hall on Melrose ave., just off Henderson Highway, was bought by the American Lutheran Church recently and converted into a chapel. A chancel furnished with altar, pulpit and lectern has been provided and the church edifice will be dedicated on Sunday.

Services have been arranged for 11 a.m., 2.30 p.m. and 7 p.m. Rev. K. Hoffeld, of Regina, Sask., president of the Canada District of the American Lutheran Church, will be the speaker at the morning and the evening services, while Rev. J. Propp, of Christ Lutheran, Winnipeg, will speak in the afternoon.

Special music for the occasion has also been provided. St. Paul's choir will sing "Faithfully Abide With Him" by George Kessel, in the morning, and "The Heavens Are Telling" by Beethoven, in the evening. Mrs. W. K. Rath, soloist in the afternoon service, will sing "O Lord Most Holy" by Frank.

Mrs. Lorraine Propp will preside at the organ and will play "Resurrection" by Lacy; "Walking With The Master" by E. Lorenz; "O Worship The King" by R. Wilson; and "The Risen Christ" by Homer.

Grace Lutheran was organized only last January by Rev. G. H. Senft, pastor of St. Paul's Lutheran as a filia of St. Paul's. It has a membership of about 17 families. Regular services are conducted every Sunday at 7 p.m.; Sunday School at 2 p.m.

A class of four children and two adults were confirmed on Palm Sunday. The congregation also has a Women's Guild of about 17 members who meet every third Thursday of the month.
