

School Addition Gets O.K. From Kildonan Voters

East Kildonan voters approved the \$70,000 addition to Lord Wolseley School at Friday's municipal elections. The money will be spent to add four rooms to the present building to relieve the congestion prevalent in East Kildonan's school population, returning some of the Lord Wolseley grades now attending Prince Edward. Prince Edward in turn can bring back their two grades now at Polson.

A total of 1,692 votes were cast for the bylaw, 922 voting against it.

F. E. Beckett, chairman of the board, in a statement to the press, said the board appreciates the response of the ratepayers of East Kildonan in passing the money bylaw. It was very gratifying to the School Board, as the extra accommodation is urgently required. He stated that the Board intends to start the project immediately after tenders are received and approved.
