

Lord Wolseley Pupils Celebrate Coronation June 1

Lord Wolseley School pupils gathered in two assemblies Monday, June 1, to celebrate the Coronation of Queen Elizabeth.

Grades I to III met in the school building where they heard Mrs. P. V. Samson speaking on the importance of the Coronation for young Canadians.

The service featured the singing of a new song especially written for this occasion. The Festival choirs from grades IV to VI sang "Land of Hope and Glory" under the direction of Miss L. M. Hudson. Miss Duerksen's class sang "Coronation Bells."
