

# Kildonan Voters O.K. New School

East Kildonan residents Wednesday approved the \$345,000 money by-law for a new 18-room school by a vote of 1,013 to 96. Only a majority was needed to pass the by-law and not a certain per centage of the electors. There were five rejected ballots.

Odd weather conditions were probably the cause of a lighter vote than might otherwise have been expected. Residents who voted showed, however, that they were fully aware of the big problems of expanding population and development which face the School Board.

One feature of the new school which will serve not only students but the rest of the community as well is the proposed auditorium to hold from 600-700 people. In an emergency the auditorium could be divided into three classrooms.

Another feature which has been out of the picture in East Kildonan education is the modern workshop for manual training to be located in the new school. The library will also be another feature which will be a boon to the students.

The erection of the new building is expected to end the staggering of classes. It will be located at Melrose and Roch, with a lane separating it from Miles Macdonell Collegiate.

It is expected the School Board will call for tenders almost immediately.
