

## MUNICIPALITY OF KILDONAN

### Council Decides on Improvements and Appoints Officers.

The regular meeting of the council of the rural municipality of Kildonan was held at the East Kildonan school house Saturday afternoon, Reeve A. R. Bredin, Councillors, A. M. McKay, Jean Fortier, J. N. McCreary, Ed Partridge, Wm. McKay and James Harper being the members present.

A communication was received from G. F. Galt, treasurer of the Winnipeg general hospital, asking for subscription to the expenses of that institution. After some discussion it was decided to postpone action in the matter until the next meeting of the council.

J. Johnston, chief license inspector, wrote submitting provisions of the new liquor license act for the information of the council.

John H. Gunn was appointed noxious weed inspector for wards 4, 5 and 6, and S. R. Henderson in a similar capacity for wards 1, 2 and 3.

Geo. McCorrister was appointed ferryman, his salary to be paid from April 21 last.

The clerk was instructed to secure figures from the different lumber companies in the city for the supply of lumber and timber for the municipality during the coming season.

H. W. Matheson was appointed foreman on public works of the municipality. Mr. Matheson was authorized to employ the scraper holders and plowmen necessary for the work, the rate of pay to be 20c per hour.

On motion of Messrs. McKay and McCreary it was resolved "that the council of Kildonan desire the municipality of Springfield to deepen the ditch north of Sec. 17, Tp. 11, range 4 east, to Beaman's corner, the council of Kildonan to pay half the cost of the said work."

Councillor Partridge moved, seconded by Councillor Wm. McKay, "that the clerk be instructed to notify the Street Railway company to put crossings and culverts opposite Pembroke and Belmont avenues on their main line of railway, west side of the highway," and this was adopted.

Other resolutions requesting the Street Railway company to put crossings opposite Brown avenue, and on lot 51 Kildonan, and culverts opposite Bowman avenue and through the dump on Bird's Hill road, were also adopted.

The councillors for wards 4, 5 and 6 were appointed a committee to arrange for the grading of Belmont street and John avenue; and also for the deepening of the ditch on the main road from Kildonan avenue to the north end of the municipality. This committee was also instructed to secure the services of an engineer to lay out Balgonie road, Polson road, Jaffray road and any other work required in their respective wards.

The sale of lands for arrears of taxes in the municipality of Kildonan will be held June 13 next.

A by-law to raise \$6,000 for the building of a school for the East Kildonan school district will be submitted to the ratepayers next Saturday.
