

Warns E.K. Residents: Be Careful

East Kildonan Police Chief Chris Enfield Friday warned East Kildonan residents to be careful following seven break-ins in the past four days.

Chief Enfield said that although there had been seven break-ins, only two radios and four or five dollars had been stolen. "It must be the work of juveniles," he said, "because it's certainly not professional work."

Sunday night there were two unlawful entries into the homes of Walter S. Large, 855 Kildonan Drive, and Peter Vankampen, 109 Mossdale Avenue. In both cases the houses were ransacked but nothing was stolen.

Tuesday night there was an attempted break-in into the apartment of Frank Dunka, Suite 15, 765 Watt Street. Nothing was stolen.

The first radio stolen was taken from the home of Frank A. Baker, 317 Hazeldell Avenue Wednesday night.

There were three break-ins Thursday night. The first was at the home of Albert E. Clay, 101 Rowendale Crescent, where "four or five dollars" was taken. The second was at the home of John Bodnar, 832 Kildonan Drive, where a transistor radio was stolen. The third break-in occurred at the home of Rudolph Schmidt, 35 Linden Avenue. Burglars failed to take anything of value.
