



**ARTIST'S SKETCH OF NEW PROPOSED ST. SAVIOUR'S ANGLICAN CHURCH**

At a parish meeting held on Oct. 18th it was resolved that a new church of St. Saviour's be erected on the site of the existing structure at the corner of Munroe and Grey.

The plan, approved by the meeting, was drawn up by Messrs. Plumpton, Nipper &

Associates, and envisages a building seating in excess of 300 persons.

On a structural concrete base, the building will be of brick, with laminated wood beams. The altar will be illuminated from the side by day-light through cathedral glass

panels and the interior of the church by concealed artificial light.

The nave will run east to west, and the new building will be joined by a narthex to the existing structure which will be moved through ninety degrees from its present

position.

The narthex will provide entrance hall and cloakroom, and the adjoining existing structure will become parish hall.

It is hoped that construction will be started at the earliest opportunity.
