

Students To Plant Trees In East Kildonan May 24

East Kildonan school children from grades 1 to 12 will plant more than 160 trees at city-wide tree planting ceremonies Wednesday, May 24th. The program will be held concurrently at the 15 schools at 11.30 a.m.

All citizens are urged to attend to lend their support to this significant Centennial program which is being sponsored by the East Kildonan Centennial Committee, chairman Doug. Brewer has announced.

At each school it is expected that the children will parade with the trees, watering cans and shovels to previously dug holes.

Following "O Canada", a short talk on the significance of the tree planting program will be given by a representative of the committee or a member of City Council and by the principal.

Following these short remarks the actual tree planting will take place.

A variety of trees has been chosen by the schools including Canada's Centennial tree, the Almey crabapple. Other varieties to be planted include Siberian Elm, American Elm, Amur Maple, Simoni Poplar, Northwest Poplar, Ash and Royalty crabapple.

A special Centennial symbol will be affixed to each tree to indicate that it was planted by the students on Arbor Day, 1967.

A limited number of trees may be available for the general public at a price of \$2.00 per tree. Reservations can be made by phoning the city hall.

Meanwhile, the Centennial

committee is proceeding with plans for the presentation of awards to East Kildonan school children who have been busy writing essays on a Centennial theme. They are being judged by the teachers and the announcement of the winners will be made soon.
