

AT KILDONAN PARK

The pupils of Elmwood and East Kildonan schools will view the Royal procession at Kildonan Park. The classes will be in session Wednesday until approximately 2 o'clock, when the scholars will proceed under the direction of their teachers and patrols to the several points from which the transportation service will be available. The transportation of all the scholars from the Elmwood schools will be in charge of the Winnipeg Electric Co., the scholars, of course, being responsible for their individual fares. Transportation of the East Kildonan scholars has been arranged with the Winnipeg Electric Co. by the East Kildonan school board. The scholars will be in their class rooms from 9 a.m. until 11 a.m. The classes will reassemble at 12.30 and will leave to join the street cars at the following points at 1 p.m.: Wolseley school, Leighton avenue and Henderson Highway; Prince Edward school at Trent avenue and Henderson Highway; Polson school, Winterton and Watt; Salisbury school, at end of the car line; St. Alphonsus school, Munroe avenue and Henderson Highway. After their arrival in the park, flags will be distributed to the smaller children. At no point will the children be standing more than four deep, this ensuring for every scholar a clear view of Their Majesties as they pass. The return of the scholars from the park will be made at approximately 5.30.

A further local touch is being lent the arrival of the King and Queen at the park from the fact that the bugle band of the 2nd Winnipeg Co. of the Boys' Brigade (King Memorial) will be in attendance and will herald the approach of Their Majesties.

Following the unique and colorful ceremonies of Wednesday, the schools will be closed Thursday and Friday.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR PARK

In view of the fact that scholars from Elmwood and East Kildonan schools will be assembled at Kildonan Park, the following list of instructions prepared by a representative committee of teachers, citizens and police should prove of wide local interest.

1. No automobiles will be allowed in the park at any time during the day. The mounted policeman on duty at the park gate is instructed to direct autos to the parking grounds which are located on the west side of Main street, a few blocks north of the park entrance.

2. Drivers of cars are asked to go directly to the parking grounds to unload passengers in order to avoid congestion of traffic in front of the park entrance. Police and scouts will aid in parking cars. When passengers unload at the parking grounds they will cross Main street to the east sidewalk and go south to the park entrance.

3. Allocated groups for which no special public transportation has been arranged are urged to arrive in the forenoon or the early afternoon.
