Toronto-Dominion Bank To Open E.K. Branch Saturday

The Toronto-Dominion Bank is officially opening two new branches in the Winnipeg metropolitan area on Saturday. These are located at Sargent and Erin and on Henderson Highway and Hazeldell ave.

With the opening of these branches Toronto-Dominion will have 19 offices in the Winnipeg metropolitan area, more branches than any other bank.

The opening on Saturday will be an historic event. This is the first time in the history of the bank that it has opened two new branches in the same city on the same day.

To give the public an opportunity to inspect the new branches and to meet the managers and staff, an "open house" is being held Saturday afternoon at both new branches. Light refreshments will be served. In the case of the East Kildonan branch, it will be officially opened at 3 p.m. by His Worship Mayor George N. Suttie.

William Crane has been appointed manager of the Sargent and Erin branch. He is well known in Winnipeg, having been assistant manager of the Main and Higgins Branch for the past two years. Mr. Crane entered the bank at Brandon 16 years ago and served in Saskatoon, Edmonton and Calgary before coming to Winnipeg.

The manager of the East Kildonan Branch will be Neil McNulty. He also is well acquainted in Winnipeg, having been manager of the Broadway and Donald Branch for several years.

He entered the bank in Toronto in 1929. In addition to serving in that city he has held posts in Rouyn, Montreal, Port Arthur, Geraldton and Edmonton.
