

Kildonan Collegiate Graduation Exercises

May 27th dawned bright and beautiful for the twenty-seventh annual graduation exercises of East Kildonan Collegiate. Parents and friends of the 64 graduates entered King Memorial Church Friday afternoon with eager expectancy to attend this very impressive service. After the speakers ascended the platform, a hush fell over the large audience as the doors of the choir loft opened and the procession of

graduates made its way to the appointed places in the pews. It was indeed a moving sight.

J. E. Scarrow, principal, was chairman for the occasion, and was supported on the platform by Rev. F. J. Ison, who led the prayer of invocation; Rev. H. S. Dodgson, who welcomed the convocation on behalf of King Memorial Church; Rev. P. V. Samson, who read the Scripture lesson, and Rev. Allen R. Huband, who delivered the address to the graduates.

The Valedictory address was given by Terry Boccock, who pointed out the importance of the school years and their far-reaching effect upon the student's life. He thanked the staff for their guidance, co-operation and friendly interest which had finally brought the graduates to this great and memorable day. In closing, he expressed the hope that "God will give us all the strength and courage to use our knowledge, not only in the interests of our own great country, but also to build a better world."

Mrs. R. M. Warne, chairman of the education committee, brought friendly greetings from the School Board, and counselled the graduates to remember that the learning process did not cease with graduation, but continued in the larger school of life into which they were now going.

At this point in the proceedings Inspector H. E. Ritter came to the platform to present the Governor-General's medal for general proficiency during the high school course. He pointed out the difficulties confronting the staff in selecting a winner from the five
