

# Miles Mac nursery school in business for new term

The nursery school program at Miles Macdonell collegiate is back in business for another term.

The nursery school is operated at the school in conjunction with the Grade 10 health and child care vocational credit course.

Jean McCormack, who teaches the course, says the nursery school is an excellent way for the students to obtain some hands-on experience while also offering an appreciated service to the

community.

The nursery, which has operated each February to June term at the school for the last nine years, can accommodate 25 children.

There are usually about 20 students taking the course. Half work at the nursery at Miles Mac while the other half volunteers at nurseries in the community to obtain credit.

Often fewer than 25 children are enrolled, McCormack says. That results in a one-to-one child-student ratio - an attractive benefit to

parents looking for a first nursery school experience for their child, she says.

Nursery school classes are held from 12:30 to 3 p.m. Mondays, Wednesdays and every other Friday; or on Tuesdays and Thursdays and every other Friday.

Parents also have the option of registering their children for five days a week. Cost is \$2.50 per day.
